Parents as Teachers National Quality Endorsement



- Twelve PAT Affiliates completed their self-study for Quality Endorsement- a yearlong process that included a thorough review by a team at Parents as Teachers National this summer.
- On October 11th ALL 12 SC Affiliates were notified that they had received the Blue Ribbon Status. Congratulations to: **Berkeley**, **Lexington SD 1**, **Darlington**, **Lexington 2**, **Clarendon 2**, **Lexington 3&4**, **Jasper**, **Richland**, **Lexington/Richland 5**, **York 1**, **McCormick**, and **Pickens**
- These 12 added to our current three from Beaufort and Charleston First Steps, and Beaufort School District, means that South Carolina now has 15 Blue Ribbon Affiliates!

Parents as Teachers 2016-17 SC PAT State Report



- 42 sites in South Carolina
- 1,967 families and 2,259 children (prenatal-5 yrs.)
- 31,674 home visits conducted
- 93% of children enrolled received annual screening
- 97% of 19-25 mo. old children had up-to-date immunizations
- 87% family retention rate (excluding those who moved out of the service area)
- All but 4 SC affiliates receive First Steps funding



4K News

- Building Learner Outcomes through Opportunities and Models BLOOM provides personalized plans for professional growth for First Steps 4K teachers for the 17-18 term. Individual goals will support the translation of knowledge into practice. Regional Coordinators will guide, support, and coach teachers during bi-weekly visits to build dynamic learning environments and positive relationships.
- National Director's Credential through the McCormick Center for Early Childhood Leadership and National Louis University SCFS 4K will be awarding this credential to the 17 directors that have recently completed the project year. This has been a fantastic pilot, facilitated by Kristine Jenkins, and we look to expand.


