THE NEED

School readiness **depends on the capacity of caregivers** to provide children with consistent, nurturing, and responsive relationships in safe, stimulating learning environments, **continuously**, starting at birth. Unfortunately, these quality early childhood experiences happen for too few children in Calhoun County.

THE GOALS

Our partnership's work, in collaboration with state and local partners, is focused on advancing Calhoun County towards these strategic goals in support of the **Profile of the Ready Kindergartner**, South Carolina's description of school readiness:

1. Expand and engage more dads in our parenting and school transition programs and community activities: Call Me Mister and 101 Black Males.
2. Become more visible in the community by getting involve in the School Improvement Council, PTO and activities at St. Matthews K-8 and Sandy Run K-8 schools.
3. Increase community collaboration and participation in Calhoun County First Steps program and activities.

THE IMPACT

In 2017-18, Calhoun County First Steps provided:

367 children and **94 adults** with **intensive support** to equip parents and caregivers with the confidence and competence to be a child's first and best teacher, and strengthen their family's health, economic, and overall (**Parents as Teachers and Countdown to Kindergarten**)

- ✓ **1 staff** working in **1** child care providers, Head Start centers and preschool classrooms with training, technical assistance, resources and support, **helping them better meet the needs of 7 children ages 0-5 in their care (Stepping Stones Child Care Center)**
- ✓ **2798 books** to **spark the love of reading** for **374 children (Imagination Library, Parents as Teachers; School Transition)**
- ✓ a total of **374 children** and **167 adults** were impacted by Calhoun County First Steps programs, resources, activities and events.

School Readiness Outcomes

What is the KRA?

In 2017-18, kindergartners across the state were given for the first time South Carolina’s newest assessment of school readiness: the **Kindergarten Readiness Assessment**, or KRA. The KRA provides a snapshot of students’ abilities at the beginning of the school year, in four domains: Social Foundations, Language and Literacy, Mathematics, and Physical Development and Well-Being. Here are the results locally and for the state:

1. **Language and Literacy:** reading, writing, speaking, and listening
2. **Mathematics:** counting, comparison, and sorting
3. **Physical Well-Being & Motor Development:** dexterity, muscular coordination, and balance
4. **Social Foundations:** following rules, asking for help, task persistence and other skills necessary to function within the kindergarten classroom

Demonstrating Readiness: student demonstrates foundational skills and behaviors that prepare him/her for instruction based on kindergarten standards.

Approaching Readiness: student demonstrates some foundational skills and behaviors that prepare him/her for instruction based on kindergarten standards

Emerging Readiness: student demonstrates limited foundational skills and behaviors that prepare him/her for instruction based on kindergarten standards

What is Calhoun County First Steps doing to improve KRA results:

Collaborate with the school district to learn KRA results of kindergarteners served through our 2018 Countdown to Kindergarten especially those kindergarteners that were also served through our Parents as Teachers (PAT) program.. If KRA results are higher for these students, will work with the school district to expand our Countdown to Kindergarten. Will increase outreach to certain underserved population of your county. Direct PAT home visitors to plan more activities around kindergarten standards.

Parents play a critical role in their child's development.

Program Description

Parents as Teachers (PAT) is an evidence-based home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:

1. **Personal Visits** at least twice monthly
2. **Monthly Group Connections** with other PAT families
3. **Screenings and Assessments** to identify developmental concerns
4. **Connections to Outside Resources** that families may need to succeed

Calhoun First Steps serves families in greatest need. Among our PAT families:

86% ... live in poverty

14% ... didn't graduate from high school

1% ... were teen parents

Parent Satisfaction Survey shows 96% of families strongly agree the parent educator encourages them to read more books to their child, increases their understanding of their child's development and help them find useful resources in their community.

This year, our Parents as Teachers program:

- ✓ Averaged 21 home visits per family.
- ✓ Identified and addressed NO potential developmental delays (ASQ Report), and made 39 connections for families to services such as employment resources, Adult Education (job skills; GED), early education programs, SCSU Speech Services, medical hearing, DSS Food Stamps, clothing-household items assistance; Mentoring New Mothers program.
- ✓ Improved parenting practices: Parent surveys show that activities in the visits have strengthen parent-child relationships.

Evidence of Effectiveness:

Parents as Teachers meets the First Steps legislation's definition of an **evidence-based** program.



Children’s reading scores improve dramatically when parents are involved in helping them learn to read.

Program Description

According to the Center on the Developing Child at Harvard University, the peak period for brain development related to language is around **nine months of age**. **One of the easiest and most effective ways to build this capacity in young children’s brains is to read to them.**

Calhoun First Steps is the local sponsor of Dolly Parton Imagination Library, which provides free, age-appropriate books to children age birth to 5 years. Operated by the Dollywood Foundation, Imagination Library is currently in more than 1,600 communities internationally and mails books to about 700,000 children each month.

Children who register with Calhoun First Steps receive one book per month by mail through the month of their fifth birthday. Each book is carefully selected by a committee of educational specialists.

This year, our Imagination Library program:

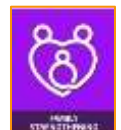
- ✓ Provided one book per month to 257 children who were referred from Calhoun DHEC WIC, St. Matthews Head Start, Calhoun DSS, Calhoun Library, St. Matthews K-8, Sandy Runn K-8 and Steping Stones Early Education Center.
- ✓ Survey results showed that families have increased the amount of time read to their child. Children insisted that their newly arrived book was read to them upon receipt.
- ✓ Received \$2000 from Tri-County Trust, each board member sponsors a child for the program and \$4,241 were raised through our 4th Annual Golf Tournament.

Child Care Training

Those who care for young children need high-quality, accessible, and affordable professional development.

Program Description

High-quality child care hinges on high-quality professional development that meets the needs of the local child care workforce.

First Steps-sponsored training is certified through the SC Center for Child Care Career Development and includes topics in the areas of nutrition, health and safety, curriculum, child guidance, professional development and program administration. Best practices in training include not only the training itself, but follow-up in the classroom.

Countdown to Kindergarten



Bringing parents and teachers together as partners sets the foundation for success in school.

Program Description

Countdown to Kindergarten (CTK) is a summer home visitation model connecting rising kindergartners and their families with their future teachers. The program is designed:

- ✓ to forge strong and lasting home-school relationships,
- ✓ to acquaint children and families with the state and classroom expectations to increase the likelihood of school success,
- ✓ to increase parent involvement in the early grades (particularly in hard-to-reach communities), when children’s learning is foundational for life success; and
- ✓ to increase public awareness of the importance of school readiness and provide ways for parents and communities to impact children’s early school success.

Countdown to Kindergarten integrates all of the following:

Home Visitation. Teachers make six visits over the summer to the homes of participating students and families. Children and families are introduced to actual materials used in kindergarten and are given a Kindergarten Transition Toolkit to keep.

Learning Celebration. The last visit is a “field trip” to the school where the child will attend class in the fall.

Public Awareness. Throughout the summer, First Steps releases tips to media to help parents and caregivers get children ready for kindergarten.

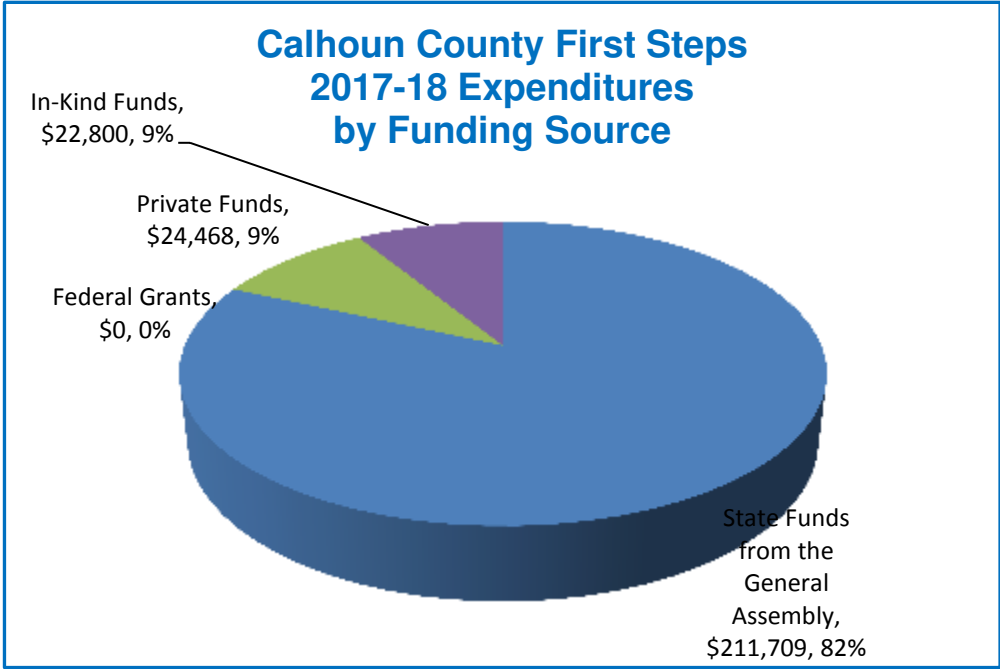

Calhoun First Steps and Calhoun DSS Host Child Welfare Improvement Team Quarterly Meeting

On June 19, 2018, Calhoun County Council provided meeting space at John Ford Community Center for the Calhoun First Steps Board and the Calhoun DSS director to host a meeting that focused on how the organizations can collaborate as a community to help strengthen the safety, permanence and well-being of Calhoun children. Forty percent of our Child Welfare Team was represented at the June’s quarterly meeting and shared a brief summary of their organization. Ideas was shared on how our team can created the most positive outcome for the County’s children.

What is First Steps?

At the state level and in every county, First Steps leverages state funding with other public and private resources to help South Carolina’s children enter kindergarten healthy and ready to succeed. First Steps programs and services support families as their child’s first and most important teacher and are customized to meet the unique needs of local communities, grounded in strong evidence, fueled by stakeholder collaboration, and accountable for results.

First Steps Goals

- (1) provide parents with access to the support they might seek and want** to strengthen their families and to promote the optimal development of their preschool children;
- (2) increase comprehensive services** so children have reduced risk for major physical, developmental, and learning problems;
- (3) promote high-quality preschool programs** that provide a healthy environment that will promote normal growth and development;
- (4) provide services** so all children receive the protection, nutrition, and health care needed to thrive in the early years of life so they arrive at school ready to succeed; and
- (5) mobilize communities** to focus efforts on providing enhanced services to support families and their young children so as to enable every child to reach school healthy and ready to succeed.
