OUR MISSION:

We get children ready.

THE NEED

School readiness **depends on the capacity of caregivers** to provide children with consistent, nurturing, and responsive relationships in safe, stimulating learning environments, **continuously**, starting at birth. Unfortunately, these quality early childhood experiences happen for too few children in Laurens County.



THE GOALS

Our partnership's work, in collaboration with state and local partners, is focused on advancing LAURENS County towards these strategic goals in support of the *Profile of the Ready Kindergartner*, South Carolina's description of school readiness:

- 1. LCFS will form a committee of community leaders across all sections of Laurens County to share resources and work to make those resources readily accessible to pre-school children and their families in Laurens County.
- 2. LCFS will revise all printed informational materials, up-date social media platforms, and work to develop a website.

THE IMPACT

In 2017-18, Laurens County First Steps provided:

- 18 children and 15 adults with intensive support to equip parents and caregivers with the confidence and competence to be a child's first and best teacher, and strengthen their family's health, economic, and overall well-being PARENTS AS TEACHERS
- 117 staff working in 18 child care providers, Head Start centers and preschool classrooms with training, technical assistance, resources and support, helping them better meet the needs of 457 children ages 0-5 in their care CHILD CARE PROVIDER TRAINING
- financial assistance to help 18 children 0-5 attend quality child care so their parents can work or attend school Child

What is the KRA?

In 2017-18, kindergartners across the state were given for the first time South Carolina's newest assessment of school readiness: the **Kindergarten Readiness Assessment**, or KRA. The KRA provides a snapshot of students' abilities at the beginning of the school year, in four domains: Social Foundations, Language and Literacy, Mathematics, and Physical Development and Well-Being. Here are the results locally and for the state:

- 4. Social Foundations: following rules, asking for help, task persistence and other skills necessary to function within the kindergarten classroom

What Laurens County First Steps is doing to improve KRA results:

Laurens County First Steps supports getting children ready and healthy to succeed in school by supporting child care centers with books and quality training for staff, and by opening all of our training sessions to public and private schools. Supporting the adults who influence and teach our children will lead to increased improvement to the KRA scores.

Bringing parents and teachers together as partners sets the foundation for success in school.

Program Description

Countdown to Kindergarten (CTK) is a summer home visitation model connecting rising kindergartners and their families with their future teachers. The program is designed:

- to forge strong and lasting home-school relationships,
- to acquaint children and families with the state and classroom expectations to increase the likelihood of school success,
- to increase parent involvement in the early grades (particularly in hard-to-reach communities), when children's learning is foundational for life success; and
- to increase public awareness of the importance of school readiness and provide ways for parents and communities to impact children's early school success.

Countdown to Kindergarten integrates all of the following:

Home Visitation. Teachers make six visits over the summer to the homes of participating students and families. Children and families are introduced to actual materials used in kindergarten and are given a Kindergarten Transition Toolkit to keep.

Learning Celebration. The last visit is a "field trip" to the school where the child will attend class in the fall.

Public Awareness. Throughout the summer, First Steps releases tips to media to help parents and caregivers get children ready for kindergarten.

Nurse-Family Partnership



Helping vulnerable first-time mothers empowers them to achieve a better life for themselves and their children.

Program Description

Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) helps transform the lives of vulnerable first-time mothers and their babies. Through ongoing home visits from registered nurses, low-income, first-time moms receive the care and support they need to have a healthy pregnancy, provide responsible and competent care for their children, and become more economically self-sufficient. From pregnancy until the child turns two years old, Nurse-Family Partnership Nurse Home Visitors form a much-needed, trusting relationship with the first-time moms, instilling confidence and empowering them to achieve a better life for their children – and themselves.

In Laurens County, Nurse-Family Partnership is implemented through Greenville Hospital System.

Parents play a critical role in their child's development.

Program Description

Parents as Teachers (PAT) is an evidence-based home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:

- 1. Personal Visits at least twice monthly
- 2. Monthly Group Connections with other PAT families
- 3. Screenings and Assessments to identify developmental concerns
- 4. Connections to Outside Resources that families may need to succeed

Laurens First Steps serves families in greatest need. Among our PAT families:

100% ... live in poverty

87% ... single head of household in need of other services

20% ... parental depression



Helping many of the youngest at risk families in Laurens County.

This year, our Parents as Teachers program:

- Averaged 2.17 home visits per family for a total of 252 visits
- Identified and addressed 8 potential developmental delays
- Improved parenting practices: KIPS scores improved by 1.17 overall
- Improved literacy skills: ACIRI scores improved by 0.5 for adults and 0.67 for children; # of books distributed (Matrix C20, Cases Visit Summary & PTS Report), or other evidence

Child Care Training

Those who care for young children need high-quality, accessible, and affordable professional development.

Program Description

High-quality child care hinges on high-quality professional development that meets the needs of the local child care workforce.

First Steps-sponsored training is certified through the SC Center for Child Care Career Development and includes topics in the areas of nutrition, health and safety, curriculum, child guidance, professional development and program administration. Best practices in training include not only the training itself, but follow-up in the classroom.

Too many families in Laurens County cannot afford quality care for their children.

Program Description

Access to quality child care is essential for children while away from their primary caregivers. Yet, of those families income-eligible for child care assistance in South Carolina, only a small fraction receive it due to lack of funds. In the absence of nurturing and consistently available family, friends or neighbors, parents are faced with few - or no – affordable care options.

LAURENS First Steps serves families in greatest need. Among our scholarship families:

100% ... live in poverty

- 87% ... single head of household in need of other services
- 20% ... parental depression

In addition to regular monitoring of childcare providers that receive First Steps scholarships, First Steps conducts all developmental screening required by PAT each year with scholarship children and connects families to needed services within the community.

ALL of our Child Care Scholarships are connected with our Evidenced Based Parents As Teachers (PAT) program.

This year, our Scholarship program:

- Provided 18 children with scholarship assistance so their parents could work or attend school
- Identified and addressed 5 potential developmental delays among scholarship children
- ✓ Made connections for families to services such as Parents as Teachers & local county activities for families
- Supported 3 small businesses in LAURENS County by subsidizing child care tuition for families who would not otherwise be able to afford quality care
- Provided 13 hours of training for scholarship parents in topics such as quality child care

NEW LOCATION IMPROVES OUTREACH TO COMMUNITY

In July 2017, Laurens County First Steps moved to a new location across town from our previous address. Our former location was difficult to find, had low visibility, and some structural issues.

Laurens County Adult Education worked out a partnership with LCSD 55 to rent the building that had housed the school district office. We were approached by Adult Ed to join them, SC Works, and Vocational Rehabilitation at this new location. The building is now known as "the West Main Center".

This collaboration of agencies allows us to expand services for our clients. LCFS clients have access to Family Literacy/Ged; resume assistance, building job skills, and opportunities to attend job fairs.

Adult Ed and SC Works can make referrals to us for childcare and parenting.

Our location is now in a prominent area on a well-traveled, main thoroughfare in Laurens. We are visible to the public, easy to locate, have adequate parking, and facilities to accommodate administrative and parent educator offices as well as a parenting room and training room.

This highlights our ability to serve as a portal, act as a community convener, and reach out to the community to share services.

Excellent Board Participation

Not everyone has a knack for selling things, but the Board of Directors of Laurens County First Steps is enthusiastic when it comes to selling. For our pecan fundraiser in FY18, we had an 80% participation rate and raised just over \$3,400. For other fund raising projects throughout the year, we increased our participation to 100% overall. (We also had 100% participation by our staff.)

It is not an easy task to sell items in a small town with all the competition from service clubs and schools. Many of our board members are well connected and have large families which they use to our benefit each year.

First Steps Goals

(1) provide parents with access to the support they might seek and want to strengthen their families and to promote the optimal development of their preschool children;

(2) increase comprehensive services so children have reduced risk for major physical, developmental, and learning problems;

(3) promote high-quality preschool programs that provide a healthy environment that will promote normal growth and development;

(4) provide services so all children receive the protection, nutrition, and health care needed to thrive in the early years of life so they arrive at school ready to succeed; and

(5) mobilize communities to focus efforts on providing enhanced services to support families and their young children so as to enable every child to reach school healthy and ready to succeed.
