Funding Formula Allocation Committee (Mark)

- Webinar held March 14th to review committee recommendations and solicit feedback from Local Partnership ED's- draft document sent out via email.
- Board Finance and Administration Committee meets March 20th to prepare recommendation for State Board Meeting on April 26th.

New Accounting Software

- MMO is in the negotiation stages of final selections.
- When the final decision is made and accepted by the vendor, we will inform everyone with the great news.

Administrative Spending Limit - 13% of state funds

- Reminder that Admin. Cap is based on <u>expenditures</u> need to track expenditures (especially vendors that are not invoicing regularly) to be sure budgeted funds will be expended by June 30th in order to maintain your admin. costs under 13%
- Any new programs must go before Program and Grants Committee (April 3 meeting) for approval before funds can be reallocated to a new program

Encumbered Funds & Fund 55 Year End Balances

 Monitor total expenditures so that carry forward will not exceed 15% of your allocation for fund 55 – next year vendor contract amounts show as "encumbered"

Finance Update

Process for Verifying Staffing Time Study results with Budget Spending Plan Cost Allocation

- Keep your time study in mind. You may choose any 12 weeks to submit as your report.
- Once you've completed your time study, please email the time sheets along with summary analysis to your program officer and SC First Steps fiscal staff (Annie & Valerie).
- If time sheet %'s are in line with BSP cost allocation %'s, then no further documentation is necessary.
- If time sheet %'s are **not** in line with BSP cost allocation %'s, then BSP must be adjusted to reflect proper time allocated to each program based on actual time sheets. The finance office will assist you in making the appropriate adjustments.

Finance Update

Federal and State Mileage Rates for 2019

- Federal as of January 1, 2019 = 58 cents per mile
- State as of January 1, 2019 = 54 cents

Reallocations

 Just a reminder – DO NOT delete the formulas in Column E of the program pages if linked to time/space allocation. Any changes must be made on the allocation worksheet or as a direct cost.

Online Communication

1. DOMAIN REGISTRATION

Each local partnership is encouraged (but not required) to maintain a public website. However, for the purposes of email communication and to secure any future web presence, each local partnership should register and maintain a unique domain name in accordance with the criteria below:

• The primary domain name should include the full name of the county followed immediately by "firststeps".

Examples: <u>www.smithcountyfirststeps.org</u> <u>www.smithfirststeps.org</u> (For simplicity, we recommend omitting the word "county" if possible.)

- Any domain names currently in use that do <u>not</u> meet this criteria may be maintained as a secondary domains and programmed to redirect to a new primary domain that meets the criteria above.
- As a nonprofit, the primary domain extension of each local partnership should be ".org" However, for the purposes of securing your online identity and increasing web traffic, other common extensions (.com and .net) may also be registered and programmed to redirect to the primary domain.

2. EMAIL

• All local partnership staff should have an email address at the local partnership's primary domain.

Example: <u>director@smithfirststeps.org</u>

- If you currently have a website, you may be able to set up email through your web hosting service.
- If you do not currently have a website (and even if you do) you can also set up email, using your domain, through Google (Gmail). Apply for G Suite for Nonprofits and receive access to G Suite Basic, using your domain, at <u>no</u> charge.

- 2. Recruit parents, caregivers, and other early childhood stakeholders to participate in online needs assessment survey
 - Each partnership will receive custom survey links in early April
 - Timeline: April-May 2019
 - County level results provided
 Summer 2019

3. Convene Focus Groups (2)

- Parents (1 required): can divide into multiple groups
 - Include parents who are **not** current or former program participants.
 - Important to hear from parents who are eligible but not currently accessing publicly funded early childhood services (4K, Head Start/EHS, child care voucher, First Steps, BabyNet/preschool special ed., home visiting).
- Child care providers (centers and home-based providers)
- Other community members
- Questions and reporting format will be provided by university researchers (est. March 28), orientation webinar early April
- Can use \$ for incentives
- Timeline: March-May (submit report by mid-May)

4. Help with local resource data

- Local school district programs for children before 5K
- Intensive parent training and support available in your county
- Timeline: May 2019

Evaluation Methods

- A *mixed-methods* approach will be used for the evaluation
 - Quantitative
 - Qualitative
- Combination of analysis of large data sets with interviews and information from key stakeholders
 - Parents, providers, staff, leaders
- Use of Social Networks Analysis
 - Provides us a method to measure number, strength, and quality of connections between organizations at the state and local levels
 - Be on the alert for requests for information regarding who your partners are as a first step!


