# Priority Needs: Summary

Through a series of community convenings, a needs assessment and asset mapping process, the following needs were prioritized for Hampton County. See our full needs assessment here: <link>.

#### **1. Counseling for Families and Children**

After reviewing the surveys submitted by parents, approximately 60% agreed that more counseling services was a primary need in Hampton County. Currently, there is one mental health provider to every 1061 people.

#### 2. Affordable Quality Childcare/Child Care Deserts

Surveys show that more quality child are centers are needed throughout Hampton County. In addition, they expressed the need for increased hours to serve families that do not work locally.

#### 3. Help for Single Parent Families

After surveying parents, 50% of completed surveys indicated there is a need for helping single parent families.

#### **INCREASE THE REACH OF FIRST STEPS SERVICES**

By FY26, the percentage of children in need who are directly served by Hampton County First Steps will increase from 4% to 6%.

#### SECOND MEASURE OF SUCCESS

By the end of fiscal year 2026, the percentage of children in need who are directly served by Hampton County First Steps high intensity programs will increase from 4% to 5%.

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
