### **Strategic Plan Process**

#### CONVENE

Held community events, starting dialogue on the needs assessment process. The importance of data collection was discussed, and attendees were made aware of initiatives being introduced that would best serve the needs of children and families.

October 2022 - January 2023



### **UNDERSTAND**

Parents and guardians were asked about their most pressing concerns to determine the top needs of the community. Data collected was used to understand where programs would best be served.

October 2022 - March 2023

### **PRIORITIZE**

Based on data collection, needs were organized and ranked to ensure that those most pressing would be addressed first. Tiered needs were then broken down into levels to create a plan on collectively addressing concerns.

January 2023 - March 2023



### **PLAN**

A strategic plan was created using data and concerns outlined in the Needs Assessment. A plan to run through to FY26 was formulated, with real goals being outlined.

March 2023 - May 2023

### **APPLY**

Parents & Childcare providers will work both independently and collectively with WCFS to ensure children are kindergarten ready. Programs will be implemented with the help of community collaborators that will utilize the objectives outlined. The strategic plan will be used as a guide to apply for funding needed to continuously run the outlined programs.

### IMPLEMENT

Meetings and work sessions will be scheduled with parents to outline feasible plan and at home curriculum that can be used to start early childhood education. WCFS will partner with community collaborators to follow through with commitments.

#### **MONITOR**

Programs will be monitored through testing results, evaluation forms and continued participation from parents. Priority will be given to monitoring percentage increase in program participants and number of children served

## **Priority Needs:** Summary

Through a series of community convenings, a needs assessment and asset mapping process, the following needs were prioritized for Williamsburg County. See our full needs assessment here: < WCFS Needs Assessment>.

### 1. INCREASE HEALTHY LIFESTYLES AND CHOICES

Educate parents and childcare providers at facilities on the importance of healthy eating and healthy lifestyle. Conduct training on healthy meals and snacks, emotional stability and life balance.

### 2. IMPROVE FAMILY AND SOCIAL SUPPORT

Provide parents with access to support and resources that strengthens their families; build their confidence, knowledge, and skills; and promote the optimal development of their children both on an educational and emotional level.

### 3. IMPROVE SCHOOL READINESS

Increase the number of families participating in evidence-based and evidence-informed parenting programs. Support parents' knowledge of early childhood milestones, kindergarten readiness, and build parents skills in supporting their children's successful transitions across early learning programs and into kindergarten.

## **Objectives**

### **GETTING CHILDREN READY FOR SCHOOL.**

Williamsburg County First Steps (WCFS) will partner with the DSS, the library, local and business communities, childhood and early education providers and parents to ensure children are prepared to enter kindergarten.

## 1. PARENTS AND GUARDIANS ARE SUPPORTED AS THEIR CHILD'S FIRST AND MOST IMPORTANT TEACHER.

Ensure that parents are educated on providing emotional and educational support to children, by providing access to tools and materials needed. Provide age-appropriate books and learning materials, along with curriculum-based information on starting early education within the household.

## 2. FAMILIES WITH YOUNG CHILDREN WILL BE MADE AWARE OF READILY ACCESSIBLE PROGRAMS, SERVICES, AND RESOURCES.

Meet with library coordinators, program directors, and board to ensure information is being dispensed in a timely manner and in a way that it reaches all families within the area, especially those in rural communities where communication may be lacking. Provide no cost training classes for parents and children, focusing on education and school readiness.

## 3. ENSURE CHILDREN IN WILLIAMSBURG COUNTY ARRIVE AT KINDERGARTEN READY FOR SUCCESS.

Work with educators in both the public and private sectors to ensure detailed expectations are outlined and that childcare providers are working towards that goal. Have information and kindergarten expectations readily available for all households, offering support and training where needed.

**Objective One:** Parents And Guardians Are Supported As Their Child's First And Most Important Teacher.

### **STRATEGY 1.1**

### **Educating Parents & Guardian**

### **SMART GOAL(S)**

- 1. Increase enrollment in the PAT program by 10 families per year for a total of 30 families by the end of FY26.
- Conduct at least 1 monthly group connections for PAT families to receive and share information, resources, and make connections and/or referrals to available resources to increase family engagement, parent education, and emotional growth.
- 3. Partner with local agencies to provide community outreach services at least twice a year in an effort to recruit families.

**Objective Two:** Families with young children will be made aware of readily accessible programs, services, and available resources.

### **STRATEGY 2.1**

### Providing access to readily available programs through First Steps

### **SMART GOAL(S)**

- Increase the number of children enrolled annually in the DPIL program from 205 to 300 by end of FY26, a 28% overall increase.
- 2. Expand resource base to raise community program awareness, increasing the number of children served using social media platforms, flyers and letter campaigns.
- 3. Multiply the financial base of the program by actively seeking grants, donations, and partnerships in an effort to increase the number of children participants.

# **Objective Three:** Ensure Children In Williamsburg County Arrive At Kindergarten Ready For Success.

### **STRATEGY 3.1**

Creating learning curriculum geared towards parents.

### **SMART GOAL(S)**

- Increase family access to healthy and affordable (free) parenting classes and workshops in order to provide parents with additional support networks and resources to include parenting workshops topics such as healthy eating and cooking, budgeting, stress management, school success, brain development, etc. in an effort to grow partnerships with community agencies, non-profits, and community leaders
- Expand the reach of WCFS programs that have a measurable impact on the health and safety of children, including programs that support healthy, safe and attached families.

## Overarching Measure(s) of Success

INCREASE THE REACH OF WILLIAMSBURG COUNTY FIRST STEPS SERVICES, BY INCREASING THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN ENROLLED IN HIGH INTENSITY PROGRAMS, ENSURING CHILDREN THAT ARRIVE AT KINDERGARTEN ARE READY FOR SUCCESS.

By FY26, the Williamsburg County First Steps (WCFS) program will increase the percentage of children in need who are directly served by the WCFS programs by 2% yearly, increasing from 48% to 54%.

By FY26, the percentage of children directly served by WCFS and enrolled in high intensity programs will increase by 2% yearly, moving from 14% to 20%.

By FY26, WCFS will ensure that the percentage of children who score at the highest level (Demonstrating Readiness) on the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment increases by 2% each year, rising from 20% to 26%.

Theses goals will be achieved through direct collaboration with Childcare providers and educators, as well as partnership with the local libraries, DSS, interagency departments, churches, local & business communities and one-on-one communication with parents and guardians.

WCFS will collaborate with the local libraries to ensure children have access to age-appropriate books, partner with the school district to ensure early educators have clearly outlined expectations and have resources readily available for parents and guardians through WCFS funded programs.
