Spring 2024 Parents as Teachers Family Engagement Survey



The South Carolina Parents as Teachers (PAT) State Office prioritizes and values listening and responding to feedback from participating families. Each year, the South Carolina PAT State Office administers a family engagement survey to gather feedback from families about their experience participating in a PAT program in their community. Feedback from this survey is used to inform changes that improve the quality of program delivery and the experience of participating families.

Over 1,200 families from 35 PAT affiliates were invited to participate in the Spring 2024 Parents as Teachers Family Engagement Survey between March 11 and May 31, 2024. Some PAT parent educators shared the link to the survey with their families via text message and/or email; others printed the survey for families to complete on paper. The survey was available in English and Spanish. There were 678 responses to the survey (estimated response rate: 55%). Families who completed the survey were invited to enter a drawing for a gift basket with educational toys for their child valued at \$30.








PAT is an evidence-based home visiting program supporting diverse, thriving families and communities across the state.
