Our partnership's work, in collaboration with state and local partners, is focused on advancing Aiken County towards these strategic goals in support of the Profile of the Ready Kindergartner, South Carolina's description of school readiness:

- Goal 1: Increase numbers served from rural areas by engaging the local communities by asking community members what they need, not just telling them. (all programs)
- Goal 2: Increase community engagement in terms of time, money, clients, collaborations, and in-kind support.
- Goal 3: Support the early childhood workforce through quality training, incentives, and working with administrators and child care directors.
- Goal 4: Empower families using a strengths-based/asset-based approach, not a deficit approach. Build trust.
- Goal 5:Engage and mobilize the community to promote early childhood education programs county-wide.

Parents as Teachers (PAT) is a home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:



Personal visits from a parent educator at least twice monthly



Monthly group connections with other PAT families

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an evidence-based program

Screenings and assessments to identify developmental concerns



Connections to outside resources that families may need to succeed



PAT recently received the highest rating from the federal Prevention Services Clearinghouse. This recognition validates the effectiveness of Parents as Teachers as a strategy for improving parenting practices, promoting early detection of developmental delays and health issues, preventing child abuse and neglect, and enhancing school readiness and success.

COUNTDOWN TO KINDERGARTEN

an evidence-informed program

Developed by South Carolina First Steps – and identified as a promising state practice by the National Governor's Association in 2005 – Countdown to Kindergarten (CTK) is a home visitation program pairing the families of rising kindergartners with their future teachers during the summer before school entry. Teachers complete six visits with each family, establishing strong connections during the summer that facilitate classroom learning throughout the year.

CHILD CARE QUALITY ENHANCEMENT



Many private child care centers strive to provide high quality care but lack the resources often available to publicly-funded early childhood programs. Our Child Care Quality Enhancement (QE) program aims to produce measurable improvements in the quality of care provided to young children. Our services include:



Rigorous quality assessments



On-site technical assistance at least twice monthly



Funding for equipment and materials



Training and workforce development



Coordination with community partners

CHILD CARE SCHOLARSHIPS

an evidence-based program

For many families in Aiken County, the cost of quality childcare is out of reach. Our scholarship program makes payments to childcare providers to care for children from low-income families so their parents can return to school or work.

Eligibility includes meeting at least 2 SCFS risk factors. Aiken County First Steps offers scholarships to families enrolled in Parents as Teachers program, as well as income-eligible children whose parent attends school or works at least 20 hours per week.

South Carolina First Steps provides eligible children with free enrollment in full-day four-year-old kindergarten programs. 

4K NEWS

In fiscal year 2019-2020, South Carolina First Steps is launching a pilot program to expand 4K enrollment within underserved communities. Ageand income-eligible children residing in any SC school district may qualify for a slot in a participating center that also serves students from eligible districts.



PUBLIC AWARENESS

Aiken County First Steps increases understanding in the community of school readiness domains and assessment, and "what works" to help young children succeed and makes information easily accessible in all communities and for all families. We strengthen interagency accountability & collaboration through the Focus on Five-Early Learning in Aiken County and Babies First Teacher in Aiken County and develop, produce and/or distribute public education materials to promote partnership's mission and inform the public of available resources.

We also sponsor, co-sponsor and/or participate in community events that reach our target audience, encourage community engagement and create public awareness and educate and engage local and state policymakers and other community leaders on the local impact of First Steps. We network, coordinate and convene local stakeholders to collaboratively build a system of care for early childhood.


