Parents as Teachers (PAT) is a home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:



Personal visits from a parent educator at least twice monthly



Monthly group connections with other PAT families

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an evidence-based program

Screenings and assessments to identify developmental concerns



Connections to outside resources that families may need to succeed



PAT recently received the highest rating from the federal Prevention Services Clearinghouse. This recognition validates the effectiveness of Parents as Teachers as a strategy for improving parenting practices, promoting early detection of developmental delays and health issues, preventing child abuse and neglect, and enhancing school readiness and success.

As the local affiliate of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, we provide free, high-quality books to children from birth until age five, no matter their family's income.

Children enrolled in our Imagination Library program receive one book per month by mail. Each title is selected by a panel of early childhood literacy experts, who are responsible for choosing books that meet the age-specific developmental needs of young children.

COUNTDOWN TO KINDERGARTEN



Developed by South Carolina First Steps – and identified as a promising state practice by the National Governor's Association in 2005 – Countdown to Kindergarten (CTK) is a home visitation program pairing the families of rising kindergartners with their future teachers during the summer before school entry. Teachers complete six visits with each family, establishing strong connections during the summer that facilitate classroom learning throughout the year.



CHILD CARE SCHOLARSHIPS

an evidence-based program

Fairfield County First Steps offers Childcare Tuition Assistance to a limited number of income eligible families whose parents attend work or school each year. Priority is given to those families who are already a part of the Tuition Assistance Program and then to those who are most in need. This program makes payments directly to the childcare provider to care for the child. In order to be a provider in this program, the facility must be certified as a Level B provider through ABC or working toward that level. Eligible families must qualify using a list of risk factors as provided by the State Board of Trustees.
All clients in this program are also clients in our Parents as Teachers program and all children are registered for Imagination Library. All assessments are conducted on the enrolled children in order to starting school.





In fiscal year 2019-2020, South Carolina First Steps is launching a pilot program to expand 4K enrollment within underserved communities. Ageand income-eligible children residing in any SC school district may qualify for a slot in a participating center that also serves students from eligible districts.





1000 Books before Kindergarten

an evidence-informed program

1000 Books before Kindergarten program is set to foster a love of reading and being read to for our preschool teachers. We go into the classrooms of EVERY 4k class in Fairfield County reading to them. We provide the classroom with new books each visit and we also give take-home books to the students several times a year. Goals are set for each classroom and once the class reaches a goal, they are rewarded. For example: Our Family Literacy program fosters a love of learning in both children and parents. Adults develop the language and literacy skills needed to support their children's early

development, and children gain the foundational skills needed to succeed in school.


