Our partnership's work, in collaboration with state and local partners, is focused on advancing Sumter County towards these strategic goals in support of the Profile of the Ready Kindergartner, South Carolina's description of school readiness:

- Provide a high comprehensive parenting program (PAT) to strengthen families and access to local resources
- Coordinate and partner with local organizations to serve as a portal for expansion early intervention programs to increase school readiness
- Improve quality professional development opportunities in order to increase the number of qualified staff for child care centers
- Improve the child care environment of child care centers enrolled in our QE strategy
- Provide and expand opportunities for children to have access to affordable high-quality child care with scholarships





Parents as Teachers (PAT) is a home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:



Personal visits from a parent educator at least twice monthly



Monthly group connections with other PAT families



an evidence-based program

Screenings and assessments to identify developmental concerns



Connections to outside resources that families may need to succeed



PAT recently received the highest rating from the federal Prevention Services Clearinghouse. This recognition validates the effectiveness of Parents as Teachers as a strategy for improving parenting practices, promoting early detection of developmental delays and health issues, preventing child abuse and neglect, and enhancing school readiness and success.

As the local affiliate of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, we provide free, high-quality books to children from birth until age five, no matter their family's income.

Children enrolled in our Imagination Library program receive one book per month by mail. Each title is selected by a panel of early childhood literacy experts, who are responsible for choosing books that meet the age-specific developmental needs of young children.

CHILD CARE QUALITY ENHANCEMENT



Many private child care centers strive to provide high quality care but lack the resources often available to publicly-funded early childhood programs. Our Child Care Quality Enhancement (QE) program aims to produce measurable improvements in the quality of care provided to young children. Our services include:



Rigorous quality assessments



On-site technical assistance at least twice monthly



Funding for equipment and materials



Training and workforce development



Coordination with community partners

Our training programs are certified through the SC Center for Child Care Career Development and include topics in the areas of nutrition, health and safety, curriculum, child guidance, professional development and program administration. CHILD CARE SCHOLARSHIPS

an evidence-based program

For many families in Sumter County, the cost of quality child care is out of reach. Our scholarship program makes payments to child care providers to care for children from low-income families so their parents can return to school or work.

Due to limited funding, priority is given to parents and children enrolled in our Parent As Teachers Program. Those enrolled are eligible to apply for Child Care Scholarships/ABC Vouchers. Families also have to meet an income eligibility and work or school/training program to receive a voucher..







I'm a single parent and the mother of two beautiful daughters. I have enjoyed being a part of the Sumter County First Steps (SCFS) Parents As Teachers Program. While participating in the program. I received my Masters Degree. This was only possible due to a First Steps Childcare Scholarship/Voucher for my youngest child and their assistance in my oldest child attending school within Sumter County.
