

Phase II Reporting Template "Community Voices"

This is the reporting template for Phase II of the Needs and Resources Assessment. The final report, and any other records you would like include, must be submitted by February 29, 2020.

As you consider the qualitative data you uncovered in Phase II, keep in mind the overarching goals of the exercise: (1) uncovering the unmet needs of children 0-5 not identified in Phase I; (2) comparing findings from Phase I to anecdotes in your community; and (3) collecting feedback to inform your comprehensive plan. Regardless of how you have chosen to conduct Phase II, focus groups and key informant interviews should have revealed the strengths and limitations of services in your county.

Now that you have findings from Phase I and Phase II, analyze the data by using the reporting tables below. Be sure to look for correlations between Phase II and Phase I results. Consider, for example: "Do qualitative and quantitative reports show cause and effect;" "Are there voices from the community that disagree with quantitative results;" "Are there needs in your county that the numbers do not show?" Although this is a fact-finding mission of gaps First Steps can fill, it is also an opportunity to discover resources offered by other organizations in your community.

If your partnership has completed interviews and/or focus groups as a minimum requirement of Preschool Development Grant (PDG) funding, you are not expected to complete any additional interviews or focus groups. Please report the key findings in the Phase II reporting template.

You are welcome to make your own guide and conduct Phase II activities as you see fit.
