MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



In 2019-2020, Chesterfield County First Steps (CCFS) continued to enhance its services to the children and families of Chesterfield County and to support the vision, mission and goals of South Carolina First Steps.

Compass Point 4K, a CCFS collaboration with Northeastern Technical College, concluded our second successful year, seeing ten children complete the program even with the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Compass Point also earned an "A" rating from the SC ABC Quality Program, signifying our commitment to best practices in getting children ready to learn and succeed in school.

CCFS's Blessings in a BackPack weekend nutritional program completed its eighth year of serving food insecure children at Petersburg Primary School. Our faith and business community volunteers continued their dedicated work for these children, packing and distributing the food even through this COVID-disrupted summer.

CCFS also continued our collaboration with McCleod Hospital's Nurse Family Partnership program and re-emphasized our Imagination Library reading program.

GETTING CHILDREN READY FOR SCHOOL

All children are ready to benefit from a quality kindergarten experience when they are five years old by September 1 of that school year. But kindergarten readiness—the critical stage at which children are prepared for learning and success—is more than a matter of age. For a strong start in school, children need positive relationships and supportive learning environments beginning at birth. At First Steps, we partner with families, caregivers, and communities to ensure that all children are prepared for success.

OUR GOALS

In support of the Profile of the Ready Kindergartner, our approach is focused on advancing Chesterfield County toward the following strategic goals:

- Goal 1: To build a dependable, sustainable and diversified funding stream to support Chesterfield County First Steps activities.
- Goal 2: To engage more parents in early childhood education efforts.
- Goal 3: Expand services to include areas of need not currently addressed by Chesterfield County First Steps.
- Goal 4: To improve the overall capacity of the board, staff, volunteers and partners to carry out the mission of Chesterfield County First Steps.

PIVOTING FOR COVID-19

When the coronavirus pandemic forced South Carolina to shut down in March 2020, Chesterfield County First Steps quickly pivoted to provide much-needed support to young children, their families and CHILD-CARE providers.

Our work has never been more critical. While children are at low risk for the serious health effects of the virus, the crisis is having a profound impact on their wellbeing and development. For children of color and low-income communities, these impacts are expected to be even more damaging. That is why Chesterfield County First Steps is enhancing our efforts to provide parents and caregivers with the services and resources they need to weather this storm.

NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP

an evidence-based program

Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) helps transform the lives of first-time mothers and their babies. Through ongoing home visits from registered nurses, moms receive the care and support they need to have a healthy pregnancy, provide responsible and competent care for their children, and become more economically self-sufficient. From pregnancy until the child turns two years old, Nurse-Family Partnership Nurse Home Visitors form a much-needed, trusting relationship with their clients, instilling confidence and empowering them to achieve a better life for their children – and themselves.

As the local affiliate of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, we provide free, high-quality books to children from birth until age five, no matter their family's income.

Children enrolled in our Imagination Library program receive one book per month by mail. Each title is selected by a panel of early childhood literacy experts, who are responsible for choosing books that meet the age-specific developmental needs of young children.

COUNTDOWN TO KINDERGARTEN

an evidence-informed program

Developed by South Carolina First Steps – and identified as a promising state practice by the National Governor's Association in 2005 – Countdown to Kindergarten (CTK) is a home visitation program pairing the families of rising kindergartners with their future teachers during the summer before school entry. Teachers complete six visits with each family, establishing strong connections during the summer that facilitate classroom learning throughout the year.

FOUR-YEAR-OLD KINDERGARTEN

South Carolina First Steps provides eligible children with free enrollment in full-day four-year-old kindergarten. In coordination with First Steps local partnerships and more than 230 private, community and faith-based preschool providers, First Steps 4K expands access to quality early education across the state.

Chesterfield County First Steps in partnership with Northeastern Technical College operates the county's only First Steps 4K program –Compass Point 4K. In 2020, Compass Point is the only SC CHILD-CARE ABC Quality program rated as an "A" center.



ELIGIBILITY

To qualify for enrollment, a child must be:



 Eligible for Medicaid, SNAP or TANF, experiencing homelessness or transiency, or in foster care

PIVOTING FOR COVID-19

When schools closed due to COVID-19, First Steps 4K classroom converted to distance-learning, with teachers creatively supporting their young learners through video chat, take-home materials, and hands-on projects that caregivers could facilitate at home.

Raising A Reader is an evidence-based early literacy and parent involvement program. Each week redbook bags containing four age appropriate books are sent home from enrolled child-care sites to increase families' access to books and to encourage preliteracy skills. Parent workshops are provided throughout the school calendar year to provide parents with interactive reading skills, book cuddling ideas, and help them develop a literacy routine at home.





Blessings in a Backpack is a weekend nutrition program that provides nutritious, easy to prepare food for the forty 4K students and their siblings at Petersburg Primary. Each week during the school year, volunteers will pack backpacks with food for the children to ensure that their nutritional needs can be met over the weekends.
