GETTING CHILDREN READY FOR SCHOOL

All children are ready to benefit from a quality kindergarten experience when they are five years old by September 1 of that school year. But kindergarten readiness—the critical stage at which children are prepared for learning and success—is more than a matter of age. For a strong start in school, children need positive relationships and supportive learning environments beginning at birth. At First Steps, we partner with families, caregivers, and communities to ensure that all children are prepared for success.



South Carolina's Profile of the Ready Kindergartner

Developed by SC First Steps and the SC Department of Education, the state's description of school readiness includes 60 developmental milestones across 5 categories:



Approaches to learning & inquiry



Emotional & social development



Physical development, self-help & motor skills



Mathematical thinking



Language & literacy development

OUR GOALS

In support of the Profile of the Ready Kindergartner, our approach is focused on advancing Orangeburg County toward the following strategic goals:

Orangeburg County First Steps seeks to increase services for early identification of physical, emotional and educational disabilities.

Orangeburg County First Steps seeks to serve as a community portal for connecting families of preschool children to services designed to strengthen families and promote optimal child development.

Orangeburg County First Steps will offer two trainings on the specific topics of the Ready Kindergartner and Early Childhood Education Standards to providers who work with children on a daily basis.

PIVOTING FOR COVID-19

When the coronavirus pandemic forced South Carolina to shut down in March 2020, Orangeburg County First Steps quickly pivoted to provide much-needed support to young children, their families and child care providers.

Our work has never been more critical. While children are at low risk for the serious health effects of the virus, the crisis is having a profound impact on their wellbeing and development. For children of color and low-income communities, these impacts are expected to be even more damaging. That is why Orangeburg County First Steps is enhancing its efforts to provide parents and caregivers with the services and resources they need to weather this storm.

IMAGINATION LIBRARY



As the local affiliate of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, we provide free, high-quality books to children from birth until age five, no matter their family's income.

Children enrolled in our Imagination Library program receive one book per month by mail. Each title is selected by a panel of early childhood literacy experts, who are responsible for choosing books that meet the age-specific developmental needs of young children.

COUNTDOWN TO KINDERGARTEN



Developed by South Carolina First Steps – and identified as a promising state practice by the National Governor's Association in 2005 – Countdown to Kindergarten (CTK) is a home visitation program pairing the families of rising kindergartners with their future teachers during the summer before school entry. Teachers complete six visits with each family, establishing strong connections during the summer that facilitate classroom learning throughout the year.

CHILD CARE QUALITY ENHANCEMENT



Many private child care centers strive to provide high quality care but lack the resources often available to publicly-funded early childhood programs. Our Child Care Quality Enhancement (QE) program aims to produce measurable improvements in the quality of care provided to young children.

Our services include:



Rigorous quality assessments



On-site technical assistance at least twice monthly



Funding for equipment and materials



Training and workforce development



Coordination with community partners

CHILD CARE SCHOLARSHIPS



Access to quality child care is essential for children while away from their primary caregivers. Yet, of those families that are income-eligible for childcare assistance in South Carolina, only a small fraction of them receive it due to a lack of funds. In the absence of nurturing and consistently available family, friends, or neighbors, parents are faced with few or no affordable care options.

Orangeburg County First Steps offers scholarships to families enrolled in programs offered by the agency as well as income-eligible children whose parents work or attend school on a full-time basis. Orangeburg County First Steps integrates scholarships with Early Steps to School Success and the Imagination Library.

Early Steps to School Success



Early Steps to School Success is a home visitation program supporting families with children prenatal to three years of age. The program is designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. Services Include: personal visits from a parent educator twice monthly, screenings and assessments, monthly group meetings and connections to outside resources.

EARLY EDUCATION PROGRAM






